While fiber arts do require an initial investment in tools and materials, those who master them will have gained the ability to apply what they have learned to other projects.

However, skilled adult assistance will be needed, as techniques such as crochet, knitting, and sewing have a steep initial learning curve, and most of the projects are illustrated with just a few process photos and no diagrams.
