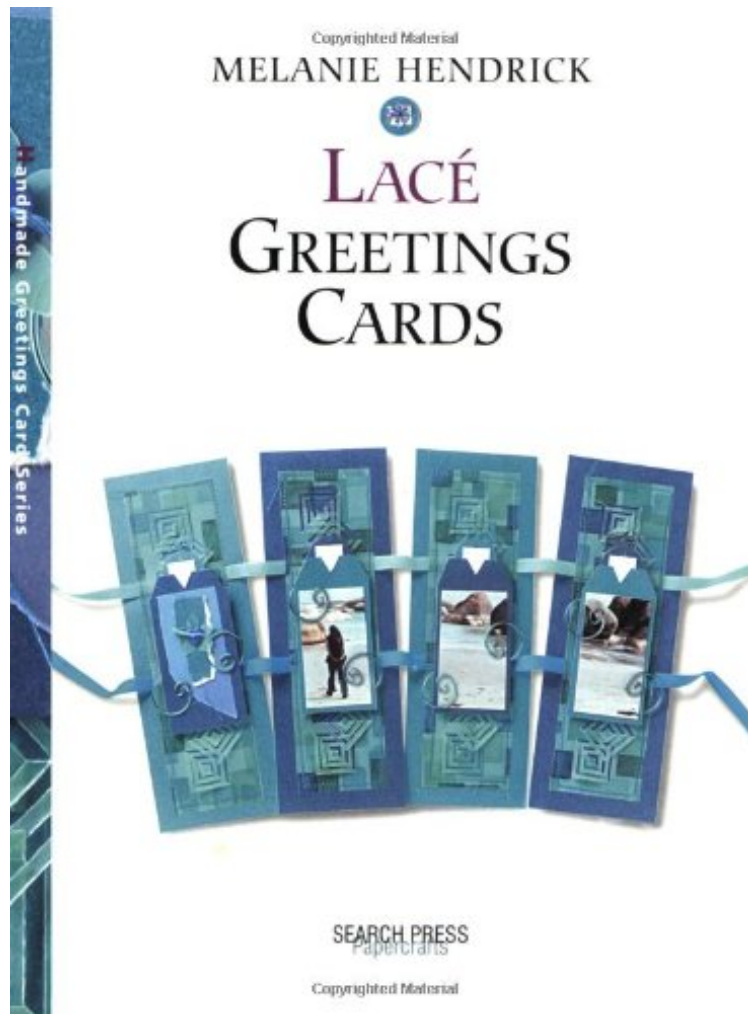

It has a variety of projects that are pleasing to the eye and easy to follow. Using duo-paper or gluing patterned paper back-to-back will enhance your cut design immensely. The reason for 4 stars instead of 5 is that the book relies on metal templates matching the lac designs which are not easy to find nowadays, although there may be plastic templates available from companies like Hot Off the Press. 2 of 2 people

Melanie Hendricks shows how to make inspirational cards for all occasions using this new technique - its name Lac meaning to interlaced in French. The technique involves making a pattern of cuts using templates. The loose edges are then folded over and tucked under each other using a folding tool to create a distinctive interlacing effect, enhanced by using duo-colour papers. In a series of step-by-step projects Melanie decorates lac cards using rubber stamps, coloured papers, beads, punch cuts and more.
